From the Interim Rector's Perch

LAST WEEK I attended a Clergy Day on the subject of anxiety (one of the best-attended clergy days they have ever held!) And it was on Election Day. No anxiety on our minds, or course.

Our Presenter was David Zahl, author of a new book entitled, *Seculosity: How Career, Parenting, Technology, Food, Politics, and Romance Became Our New Religion and What to Do About It*. He projected the above picture of Dis-



ney character Cruella De Vil on the screen. It bore this caption: “Me trying to excel in my career, maintain a social life, drink enough water, exercise, text everyone back, stay sane, survive and be happy.”

I suspect many of you can identify with this image as well as I can. I don't have to lecture you on the ferocious pace of our lives these days or the high level of expectation we place on ourselves. It is no wonder that anxiety abounds.

Enter: Advent. Just in the Nick of time (pun intended) our liturgical calendar brings us into a season of “downtime.” Downtime? Certainly not in the culture surrounding us. But that is the point. We need downtime, God knows!

Every liturgical moment is an opportunity to experience the hint of a different rhythm of life than our usual breakneck pace. In liturgy we experience silence—pauses—music—and receiving (rather than achieving). If we were being truthful, we would have to acknowledge that it is not only our children who get antsy during worship. All of us have felt that uneasiness when we have to wait for the Lector to walk to the front to read, when Mike gives us a little extra silence between a reading and the next hymn, or when the time between the return to our seats after receiving communion and the beginning of the Postcommunion Prayer seems a bit too long.

We have grown so accustomed to background noise that silence has become to signal that something has gone wrong. Remember how shocking the silence was when air traffic was halted in the days after 9/11? Suddenly we were aware of the sounds of nature which jet engines usually mask. And what about power outages? Rather than enduring silence, we all rush to fire up our

noisy generators. Silence has become a negatively charged space to us. I was reminded the other day of a famous piece by composer John Cage. The piece is called 4'13" (Four Minutes and Thirty-three Seconds.) In it a pianist comes onstage, sits down and closes the cover over the keyboard, takes out a stopwatch, and starts, stops, and restarts it until the final stop at 4'33". Silence. During a post-concert discussion at the work's premiere in a rural venue in New York, Cage biographer David Revill notes, one local artist stood up and suggested, "Good people of Woodstock, let's drive these people out of town." We just hate silence.

And yet, we so need silence. We need that counter-cultural rhythm of life which is a glimpse of the realm of God: silence—pause—music—receiving: repeat. On a really good day we can take with us some of the final blessing: the Peace of God which passes all understanding.

Advent is a particular time of year for us to claim some "downtime" with God. When our musicians met to plan our Advent liturgies, we decided to dial things back a notch. We will try to incorporate more silence and pauses which, after all, in music are known as "rests". We will try to allow ourselves to rest in the Lord with more meditative offerings. We will try to slow ourselves down a bit so that we can step off the merry-go-round into God's time. Did you ever contemplate the possibility that God's time might be moving more slowly than ours?

The author of the Second Letter of Peter refers back to Psalm 90 when he says: "But do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day." And then he continues: "The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance."

I imagine this means God is so aware of what is happening every moment at every place, that only God lives time to its fullest potential. And if God seems slow to us, we should rejoice, for we have far to go and we need some "extra" time. For us, the road that leads to Bethlehem will be a four-week journey. Those four weeks of Advent will contain a thousand years of God's love and mercy and Grace. Will we notice it? Will we hear God in the silence? Or will we fly past, hearing only the loud, shrieking merry-go-round as we strive for that elusive brass ring?
